



NASCAR Sprint Cup Series Trophy

The NASCAR Sprint Cup Series Trophy, handcrafted of sterling silver by world renowned silversmiths Tiffany & Co., and hoisted for an unprecedented four consecutive seasons by NASCAR Sprint Cup Series champion, Jimmie Johnson, will be on display every race weekend throughout the 2010 season at the Sprint Experience.

The perpetual base and the trophy were designed in late 2003 in preparation for the 2004 NASCAR Sprint Cup Series season.

Kurt Busch and Jack Roush were the first recipients.

Each year, two new trophies are produced for the winning owner and driver. The design features flowing checkered flags rendered entirely in sterling silver sitting atop an ebonized wood base. The crafting of the trophy takes nearly four months and at least eight Tiffany & Co. Master Craftsmen work on the cup. Approximately 80 hours of etching are necessary to create the flag's checkered pattern.
